

Images made in the Course of Surveying the Carhoovauler Souterrain, south of Enniskeane, Cork



This is the entrance box to the Carhoovauler souterrain. Three ogham inscribed stone slabs were used in its construction.



Carhoovauler is a clay tunnelled souterrain and it is in a ringfort. This view shows a creepway between 2 chambers.
